

Hello FTPC,

In Jeremiah 50-51, the Lord is putting the final touches on a delicate argument. The book of Jeremiah discusses the fall of Judah. It covers that moment when the people of God transition from having a nation-state to, everywhere, being under occupation. And the Lord is clear within Jeremiah and the other prophets, that the exile that Israel and Judah will be enter is due to their own misdeeds and sin. In witnessing Babylon take over their territory and exile the people, they are facing the consequences of their sin.

But, as Israel is facing their sin, you can feel the questions begin to bubble up. Are they truly worse than their neighbors? Babylon is being used as the tool for Israel's exile, yet Babylon is known for horrific sins itself. So, what does this mean for God's justice?

The Lord proceeds to make clear that the judgment is coming not just upon Judah, but upon the surrounding nations as well. And Babylon especially, will be judged according to Babylon's own standard of judgement. Where she has been harsh, harshness will follow; where she has been ruthless, ruthlessness will follow her.

When we eventually get to Revelation 18, we read, again, about the fall of Babylon. Which is... odd. Because Babylon hasn't really been a major player on the world stage for the whole New Testament. And yet, as you read, you see that the Lord's judgement upon Babylon is the judgement of a nation that is arrogant and proud, a nation that has committed itself to holding up idols, including idolizing itself. Babylon trusted in its wealth and international relations, and it slaughtered God's people. As John is recording the word of the Lord in Revelation, the Babylon he is speaking of, likely isn't Babylon at all. Rather, it is Rome. So, why doesn't God just say that?

Because, the passages in both Jeremiah and Revelation are invitations for the reader to trust in God's own faithfulness. It is as though God is building up a resume of his interactions with his people. Once, you were in conflict with an over-whelming power that was arrogant, cruel, and devoted to Self-idolatry in Egypt. And the Lord rescued you and brought Egypt down. And in Babylon, you were in

NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER IN TUKWILA: THURSDAY MAY 2, 2024

The National Day of Prayer is an annual observance held on the first Thursday of May, inviting people of all faiths to pray for the nation. It was created in 1952 by a joint resolution of the United States Congress, and signed into law by President Harry S. Truman. This observance exists to communicate with every individual the need for personal repentance and prayer, and specifically, to mobilize the Christian community to intercede for America's leaders and its families. The Task Force represents a Judeo-Christian expression of national observance, based on our recog-

nition of the many prayers lifted up to the Lord as the United States was born and in reverence for the God of the Bible.

The National Day of Prayer stands as a call for us to humbly come before God, seeking His guidance for our leaders and His grace upon us as a people. We, and indeed every nation that has believers in Jesus, are called to pray for where God has placed us. We are called to "seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare." (Jeremiah 29:7)

Our 2024 National Day of Prayer theme, "Lift up the Word; Light up the World" is based upon 2 Samuel 22:29-31. As we prepare for the National Day of Prayer on May 2nd, we rejoice in the knowledge that there will be millions of prayers prayed from tens of thousands of gatherings across America and around the world. We must pray fervent, faithful, nation-changing, history-writing prayers that turn America's hearts from evil agendas that bring about death and draw all people into the arms of a loving God who is our only true hope, help, love, and Lord.

In the Mighty name of Jesus we pray, amen!

The National Day of Prayer will be observed in Tukwila on Thursday, May 2 where we will gather at 11:45 am in front of Tukwila City Hall. Mayor Thomas McLeod will be issuing a Mayoral Proclamation promptly at noon. Prayer will follow.

JUNE MISSIONS: PRESBYTERIAN REFORMED MINISTRIES INTERNATIONAL

Presbyterian Reformed Ministries International was founded in 1966 as the **Presbyterian Charismatic Communion**. PRMI has been committed to working, often as a prophetic voice, within the Presbyterian and Reformed denominations.

Representatives have been present at PC(USA) General Assemblies, usually with a booth of literature, and since

1974 have sponsored a charismatic worship service. Prayer vigils were held from 1991–2002 at these Assemblies; most of them were led by Rev. Douglas and Carla McMurry.

Representatives have been present at the Reformed Church in America's General Synod and at each of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church's General Assemblies since its for-

mation 26 years ago. In the past ten years the ministry has worked with pastors and laity of the United Reformed Church in the United Kingdom.

We also have growing partnership with Evangelical Presbyterian Church, plus frequent connections of with Reformed Church of America, Christian Reformed Churches, Evangelical Covenant Order of Presbyterians, and various different denominations in the Reformed stream of the body of Christ. **THE DUNAMIS PROJECT** is the central training of PRMI to help you cooperate with the Holy Spirit in whatever ministry you may have, in whatever part of the world you may live. Thousands of Christians around the world have experienced a dynamic change in their ministry as they have learned how to cooperate with the Holy Spirit.

IGNITE provides opportunity for a congregation to catch the

Holy Spirit's flame and grow in faithfulness to Jesus Christ. Ignite events are condensed workshops, typically conducted on Friday evenings and all day Saturday. Ignite utilizes teaching material from the Dunamis Project.

At a **WITH THE WIND** conference, young adults learn what it looks like to cooperate with the Holy Spirit in

their day-to-day lives? This is the question that they will be engaging each summer. It is a time of fellowship, Spiritfilled worship, teaching, and meeting God.

GROWING THE CHURCH teaches about the 7 dynamics of cooperation with the Holy Spirit so that you and your congregation can enter the grow with Christ and the Holy Spirit, through which Christ grows His Church.

The retreat, intended for pastors accompanied by others in their church leadership, gives participants tools so that when they return to their congregations they can implement what they have learned.

The **ADVANCED COURSE ON HEALING AND DELIVERANCE** gives an opportunity for participants to do healing and deliverance ministry under the direction of the Holy Spirit. You might even experience some healing in your own life, while learning how to share the same in the lives of others.

EXOUSIA is the training program where PRMI raises up new teachers, new leaders, and new intercessors for the work of expanding the reach of PRMI. Exousia is where we equip our faculty, apprentice teachers, track directors and site team members. It is where you will get our DNA.

PRMI equips and mobilizes intercessors. Prayer under girds everything PRMI is about. Prayer is our first priority because it is the key to our vital life in Jesus Christ and cooperating with the Holy Spirit. Over the years, the Holy

conflict with an overwhelming power that was arrogant, cruel, and devoted to self-idolatry. And the Lord rescued you and brought Babylon down. And we can write the exact same words for other empires like Rome, and at the end, the forces of darkness in the world. By the time we get to Revelation, Babylon is no longer talking about a specific place, or a

specific nation. Instead, it is the Kingdom of Darkness. Babylon "stands for the pride of mankind and for the heathen city-empire. For John, Babylon is the great city, the symbol of mankind in community opposed to the things of God".

And it is into this cycle, that God

issues Revelation 18. It is as though God says "I saved you from Babylon in Egypt, and Babylon in Babylon, Babylon in Persia, Babylon in Rome, and Babylon at the end. Dear child, why do you fear Babylon?" In every case, it looks like evil is winning, and in every case, the Lord rescues his people and brings the wicked down.

Spirit has led us into many different program expressions to encourage the work of prayer.

DUNAMIS FELLOWSHIP NORTHWEST US:

Often, for us, the struggle is not that Babylon is persecuting us, but rather that we watch as Babylon

> seems to be advancing. We watch as hate speech fills streets, as children are kidnapped, and as wars rage. We hear whispers, or sometimes shouts, of people who are facing direct and profound persecution for their faith.

> In the face of these things, pray. Turn to the almighty God who is able to do

infinitely more than you ask or can imagine. But, also, trust in the faithfulness of the Lord. For, the Testament of his Word, and the testament of our lives, is that God is faithful.
