As I write this in a late August heat wave it seems a bit out of season to use a snow illustration but that is what I am going to do. I learned to drive in Southern California. No snow. When I got to

the northwest I had to learn how to drive in snow and ice. At that time most cars were rear -wheeled drive. I remember hearing often that if a driver went into a skid on ice they were to "turn in the direction of the skid." I knew the teaching well. But I didn't really know what it meant since I hadn't experienced it yet. So....I remember during a snowy day in winter carefully driving over to an empty packed-ice parking lot. Yup! I practiced intentionally (and safely) going into a skid and then correcting it. Now I not only knew the instruction but I could practice it as needed.

Paul said to Timothy in I Timothy 4:16, "Watch your life and doctrine closely. Persevere in them..." You will hear that a lot at FTPC this fall. In the coming months we move from summer to fall and then into winter. Seasons change. And so it is in Christ's Church. We are in a season of moving out of the PCUSA and into ECO (see separate article for an update on the process). Thankfully, with Seattle Presbytery's gracious response, the process has gone very well and is not even on the radar of most of FTPC's attendees. Rather, and rightfully so, our focus is on our ongoing mission of knowing Christ and making Him known. That said, the anticipated completion of our transfer to ECO this fall seems to me a golden opportunity to review again what it means, as Christ's followers, to "watch our life and doctrine closely." ECO prefers the use of "covenant partners" rather than "church members" to emphasize theologically that we belong to Christ and to one another in Him rather than simply to an organization. So I see this fall as a good time for current FTPC church members and current non-attendees who desire to join FTPC to have the opportunity together to commit to being covenant partners of FTPC.

Our overall theme this fall will be to "watch our life and doctrine closely." Here is where the snow analogy applies. "Turn in the direction of the skid" is akin to doctrine. It is correct teaching that should be known to safely drive. But by itself, if not applied or understood through experience, it is merely an empty slogan. Getting out on to a parking lot and experiencing this doctrine is akin to life. Both the doctrine and the living it out are necessary for fulfillment. There are Christians and churches who emphasize mentally knowing correct biblical doctrine but fail to exercise and apply these truths in life. On the other hand, there are well-meaning Christians and churches who emphasize living "good lives" but, not being anchored in scripture, fail to truly represent the transforming ethics of the kingdom of God. It is the Holy Spirit who calls us to balance both the correct doctrine of scripture, inspired by the Holy Spirit, and the correct living for Christ, enabled by letting the Spirit transform our hearts. Join me this fall as we learn to "watch our life and doctrine closely and persevere in them."



Update on FTPC's Dismissal from PCUSA to ECO

FTPC's transfer from the Presbyterian Church (USA) to the Evangelical Covenant Order of Presbyterians (ECO) is almost complete. This past spring we completed a "Due Diligent Document" for Seattle Presbytery's Administrative Commission [AC] overseeing our transfer. In July, the

AC sent to our Session their recommended terms of dismissal. This recommendation's main requirement was a two-part financial assessment: the Per Capita equivalent of three years (\$9,508.14) and



the Trust Clause Obligation which is based on 1.5% of the assessed value of the property and building (\$8,523.00). Adding in some attorney/administrative costs bring the final total to a little over \$19, 600. The spirit in which Seattle Presbytery and the AC has worked with us during this time has been very gracious, driven by a mutual desire to honor each other in our ongoing work for God's kingdom. At their August 17 meeting our Session agreed with the AC's recommended terms of dismissal, believing that this is very fair. [Side note: there are other presbyteries in the PCUSA that have required, and are requiring, departing churches to pay the full price for their facility – and have done so in an antago-

nistic spirit. Each presbytery is free to decide how they deal with departing churches. Legally – in our state – Seattle Presbytery could press departing churches to pay 100% of assessed value. By God's grace, we have been part of a kingdom-vision presbytery.]

The AC will present our terms of dismissal to Seattle Presbytery at its next meeting, October 18. Assuming acceptance by Seattle Presbytery, the legal finalization of the process (we have already been

accepted by ECO pending Seattle Presbytery's concurrence) will take a few weeks. So perhaps by November, and almost certainly before the end of 2016 we will be officially ECO. Although given the option to pay our 18K plus over time, the Session has chosen to pay it all in one lump sum (Brian referred to Proverbs 3:27-28 and Dick to Romans 13:8). Then we will no longer be straddling the fence but be fully committed to be responsible ECO partners.

P.S. If you are a current member of FTPC and would prefer to stay in a PCUSA congregation, please let Pastor Nick know and with Seattle Presbytery's cooperation, we will transfer your membership.



Last January, our Christian Education Team instituted a significant change to our 9 am Sunday School hour. A new format, called "Generations," was instituted. This

format featured a common gathering time with snacks, an opening time of presenting a scriptural theme with all ages present, and then a break out time into age appropriate groups for discussion and application of the biblical theme. Overall, this approach was received

very favorably. Adult attendance that hour doubled.

Some tweaking was made along the way and, based on surveys taken before the summer break, we are instituting a few more tweaks as we head into fall. While overall response to Generations was very positive, there was a lack of a consistent curriculum that could be both kidfriendly as well as a springboard into age-appropriate

depth of application. Although Heather Covarrubia has now moved to Oklahoma, she did much research this summer. Through her efforts, we now have a new curriculum that meets our need. Also, Aaron McGruder has agreed to oversee Generations. Thanks, Heather and



Aaron. We will return to our regular schedule on September 11th, which includes the beginning of "Generations". Come be a part of this time of being "rooted and built up" (Col. 2:6) in Christ.
